

## WHAT IS THE TRANSFUSION MEDICINE EDUCATION SYMPOSIUM?

The main objective of this educational event is to provide health care professionals in Ontario with up-to-date information on best practices in transfusion medicine. Ultimately, the goal of the symposium is to improve outcomes in patients requiring transfusion. The symposium is delivered in partnership by the Ontario Regional Blood Coordinating Network and Canadian Blood Services.



The Ontario Regional Blood Coordinating Network (ORBCoN) is a provincially funded program whose mission is to inspire and facilitate best transfusion practices in Ontario through patient safety initiatives, education and utilization



Canadian Blood Services (CBS) manages the national supply of blood, blood products and stem cells, and related services for all the provinces and territories (excluding Quebec). CBS also leads an integrated, interprovincial system for organ donation and transplantation for all of Canada.
